B. Committee Reports

Yaklin, Chair was not present at the meeting. However, Terry Coy reported that both Miriam Corbin and Joy Litteral are resigning their positions as board members. John Titus will be leaving the board because his term is over. Therefore we will need to elect three new board members.

2. Auction Committee – Brad Witt, Chair was not present at the meeting. However, Terry Coy reported that only one auctioneer submitted an auction for this convention.

3. Audit Committee – Carl Tackett, Chair was not present, therefore no report.

4. Historian Committee – Mary Lou Bougher, Chair was not present, therefore no report.

D. Web site

Ken Jinde was not present to report on the web site. Terry Coy reported that Ken has tried to update the Web site but reported that he needs a Webmaster to do the updating. Terry will talk to Ken who will contact Linda for a Webmaster.

E. Other Old Business

New Business

A. President's Report – Terry Coy
Terry thanked Fred Kunz for all his work with the hotel and the hospitality room. Terry presented Guidelines for running the club/convention that he has developed. Terry would like each officer/director to have a copy and to have a copy for all club members. Linn motioned that copies of the guidelines be made and distributed to officers and board members and that it be voted upon at the next/last board meeting. John Titus seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Secretary's Report – Karla Hartzheim. Karla reported that we currently have 410 members (this includes non-USA members). 54

members did not pay their dues. There are 26 new members since the last convention. The decrease in membership and ways to attract new members were discussed. Rich Habernicht made a motion that a special offer be made for first time members if they join online. Linn Schultz seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously. Karla thanked Linda Titus for all her help this past year. Karla reported that supplies were needed and purchased. Karla reported that we had one deceased member this year, Henry Barbee from Illinois. Karla reported the following for Convention 2007 in Peoria: 95 families pre-registered, 90 paid for banquet, 33 mugs sold. Karla will put out old newsletter and mugs in the front entry. They are free to members.

C. Treasurer's Report – Richard Hartzheim. Richard provided copies of the financial statement for each member that was present. He reviewed income and expenses and reported that the club was ahead \$1025 for fiscal year June 1, 2006 to May 31, 2007. Linn Schultz made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented. The motion was seconded by Allen Di Marco. The motion passed unanimously.

D. 2008 Convention in Louisville, Kentucky – Terry Coy. Terry reported that we have a nine month window to adjust numbers for the 2008 convention from the numbers we have for the 2007 convention. He will look closely at the numbers and make any necessary adjustments so that we are not charged any extra fees.

E. 2009 Convention in Columbus, Ohio – Terry Coy. Terry announced that the convention will be in Dublin, Ohio at the Embassy Suites. Room price will be approximately \$100 per night. Terry will meet with the group from Ohio at the end of August.

F. 2010 Convention – Terry Coy
The 2010 convention might be in Indiana. This is not confirmed.

G. Newsletter Editor – Linda Titus. Linda reported that there have been vast improvements in the newsletter. All members present agreed. Linda said that she still needs more articles.

H. Other New Business

1. Allen Di Marco reported that he has collected \$120 as of this morning. An additional piece has been added for the raffle. Name drawn first will get choice.

2. Linn Schultz gave the new treasurer old records to be looked at. New treasurer can decide what should be kept and what should be destroyed.

3. Having only two locations for convention and alternating these sites was discussed.

4. Karla Hartzheim talked about mentoring for new members and first time attendees. Linn Schultz volunteered to be a mentor and passed a sign up sheet for others to mentor. Linn suggested that mentoring be included on the registration form. Karla will take care of this.

5. The board members discussed providing a proposal for a Web site and Webmaster.



6. Discussion also included price to pay for these services. Hopefully this can be done soon so that the board can give approval and the Web site can be updated.

Adjournment - There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned by Terry Coy at 10am.

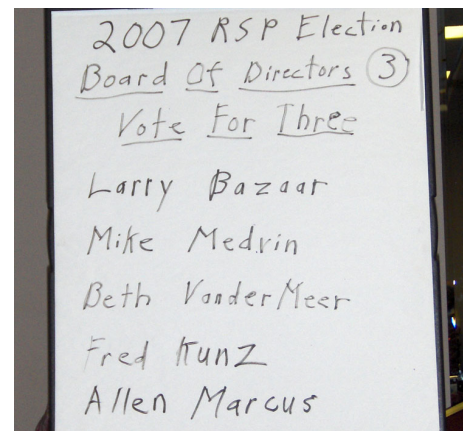
Business Meeting Minutes

C. Auditors Report - Ed Smith and Carl Tackett did the audit with the Treasurer, Richard Hartzheim. Carl reported that everything is in order.

D. Nomination Committee - Slate of Candidates and Nominations - Bob Yaklin, Nomination Com-

mittee chair reported that we need three new board members. John Titus needs to be replaced as this is the end of his second year. Discussion followed and a motion was made by Linn Schultz to accept the exceptions that were made for this meeting only. Mike Medvine seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion was carried. H. Do-It-Yourself Auction Report

I. Treasurer's Report - Richard Hartzheim reviewed the expenses and income for the club. These numbers were on the yellow sheet included in each registrant's packet. Richard reported that the club was ahead \$1025 for the fiscal year of June 1, 2006 through May 31, 2007.

J. Secretary's Report - Karla Hartzheim reported that we have 416 members (443 last year) and 54 members (59 last year) did not pay their dues. There have been 31 new members since last convention and six new members this convention. As of 11 pm last night we have 136 families registered, 106 for the banquet and 41 mugs have been sold. We have one deceased member since last convention, Henry Barbee of Illinois.

K. Results of Election - Bob Yaklin reported that the results for this election were very close. The three people voted to the board of directors are: Beth Vander Meer-Michigan, Allen Marcus-Virginia, and Larry Bazaar-Illinois.

L. Other

- Allen DiMarco reminded the membership that raffle tickets are still available at 3 for \$10. There are two pieces, first name drawn gets choice.

- Karla Hartzheim reminded membership that there are more mugs, \$5 each.

- Ralph Mitchell brought guests this year and last. Last year both joined.

- RSP plaques are available in Mike Medvine's room.

- Terry Coy thanked the staff of the hotel for their excellent work.

- Convention 2008 will be in Louisville, KY, July 31 to Aug 3.

- Convention 2009 will be in Dublin Ohio. Currently looking at Embassy Suites in Dublin.

- Terry Coy discussed room rates for convention. Other discussion ensued.

- Frank Huber brought up the auction and suggested fewer items, shorter time. It was explained that once the auctioneer is appointed we can not control time or number of items. Much discussion about this issue but nothing can be done.

B. Minutes Approval

Grady Hite motioned to approve the minutes from the last post-convention board meeting in Novi, MI.

3. Board Member Elections for 2008 - Linn Schultz made a motion that all three new board members will have a term of two years and that Grady Hite and Rich Habenicht will be replaced at the next convention. Motion seconded by Grady Hite. There was no discussion and the motion passed unanimously

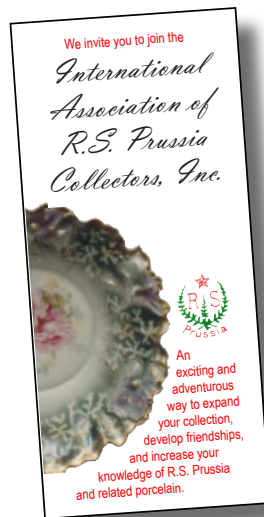

The Royal Vienna Mark (and its many variations and similarly styled marks) remains one of the major mysteries confronting R. S. Prussia collectors. The seminar encompassed the history of the original Royal Vienna porcelain factory, "generic Royal Vienna" (porcelain by smaller companies that "pirated" the Royal Vienna name after the original company closed, and "RS Prussia Royal Vienna", the porcelain that's marked with the RS Prussia/Royal Vienna crown marks and is generally attributed to the Rheinhold Schlegelmilch R. S. Prussia factories.

The original Royal Vienna factory was established in Vienna, capital of the Austro-Hungarian Empire in 1719, by a Dutchman, Claude Dupaquier. It was the second hard paste porcelain factory, following the famous Meissen factory of Germany. There are over 40 marks; most of them are what are known to as "beehive marks". The beehive mark was actually a "blue shield" mark, but when inverted, appears to be a beehive. It was simple in its design and easy to reproduce. Thus, when the factory closed in 1865 (four years prior to the opening of the R.S. factory in rural Suhl, Prussia), smaller companies began to copy the mark in the hope that the Royal Vienna name and mark would add prestige to their products. This is probably true of the R. S. factory as well, around 1905.

There are numerous versions of the RS Prussia Royal Vienna (RSP-RV) marks. Generally, the marks comprise of the words "Royal

Vienna", a five-pointed crown with orbs (and sometimes small pearls on the orbs) and (sometimes) the word "Germany" below the crown. Use of the word "Germany" seems to indicate there wasn't a serious attempt to defraud or mislead buyers, as the original Royal Vienna did not originate in Germany.

RSP-RV marks are seen in varying shades of red or green and in gold. There are several related marks with the RSP-RV crown, such as the "Viersa" mark, small crown (without any text), the initials "A.K.B", "Royal Coburg" + crown and "Germany", and the RSP double mark. The double mark comprises of the RSP red mark and the RV crown (in gold) without "Germany". The seminar presented these and other marks in detail and then depicted them together for comparison purposes to show their extremely close similarities.

Along with the study of the marks, a history of the RSP factory and early 20th century pictures of Suhl were presented.

The various theories concerning

the origins of the RSP-RV marks were presented, which include: first, the porcelain was produced at the RSP factories (in Suhl and Tillowitz); second, the items were decorated and marked at a decorating studio using RSP blanks, and third, the items were made in Japan by several Nippon factories, using the RSP-RV marks to deceive buyers and circumvent import restrictions.

The seminar presented various “links” and “mysteries” that showed many identical and highly similar mold and design characteristics. It also covered some aspects that differed, e.g., some RSP decals do not appear on RSP-RV pieces. Numerous examples were presented, giving the audience ample opportunity to draw their own conclusions.

Members of the audience provided additional information and theories, including mention of the possibility of early “industrial espionage” at the first Meissen factory that brought the hard-paste porcelain process to Vienna in the early 1700s, and the firing process used with the double mark that supported the theory that the RSP-RV items were indeed manufactured at the Schlegelmilch factories.

We hope this summary provides you with a helpful overview of the

seminar. If you were unable to attend, we hope you will definitely be able to be at next year’s convention in Louisville, Kentucky!

❷ Presentation & Solicitation at Every RS Prussia Auction by Board & regular Members

- a. Talk to the Auctioneer for permission to do a short presentation and to pass out applications to RS Prussia collectors who are not members.

Prussia members to join immediately.

c. Have RS Prussia Auctioneer offer to buy a membership for all RS Prussia collectors who are not members. Reimburse the RS Prussia Auctioneer through the RSP International.

b. Ask all auctioneers to supply the prices from all the Prussia Auctions so they can be published in the RS Newsletter.

❸ Dealers/eBayers/Mall Web sites/Individual Web sites

- a. Buy a membership for a new person who buys a piece of RS Prussia from you.
- c. Advertise the RS Prussia Collectors Club on your web site and encourage new collectors to ask questions and join.
- d. Send application to those individuals who purchase from you or your Web site.
- e. Follow up on RS collectors, where you have sent out or given a membership application.

❹ RS Prussia Web site

- d. Have a person dedicated to answer all the questions from our Web site within a week, and have carbon copied answers to the general questions and then e-mail their e-mail addresses to the chair person of the region that they are located in so they can be invited to the local R.S. Prussia chapter meetings. A list of all the chair people and the regions will be nec-

essary so that we can invite the Web site visitors to the right areas.

❺ Free night(s) stay at the Annual RS Prussia Convention for Members who:

- a. Bring in four or more first time new members [one free night]
- b. Bring in seven or more first time new members [two free nights]
- c. Bring in ten or more first time new members [three free nights]

❻ Tracking New and Old Membership Credits for a new member joining the RS Prussia Collectors' Club can only be given in any of the following ways:

- a. On membership applications, a line will be installed for all referrals. A new member should fill this out with your name, if applicable. It is the total responsibility of an existing member for this to happen, prior to the application's submittal to the RS Prussia Secretary.

- 7]. Cover the many activities of the RS Annual Convention including:

 - b]. attend the RS seminars
 - c]. visit the hospitality room
 - d]. attend the ice cream social
 - e]. attend the new member meeting
 - f]. attend the general membership meeting
 - g]. attend the "Do-It-Yourself" Auction
 - h]. attend the banquet
 - i]. attend the RS Convention Auction
 - j]. participate in the room walk through

“Will it play in Peoria?”

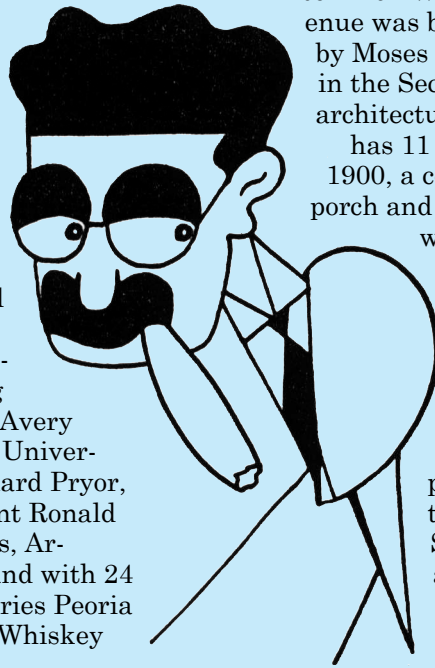
Our own private tour by the Peoria Historical Society members led by Dottie, Alice, and Duffy did indeed prove to be a glimpse into the earlier resplendent and genteel era filled with wonderful redstone mansions with RS Prussia, Tiffany lamps, period home furnishings, wonderful antiques, vintage clothing and other early memorabilia.

The oldest standing house in Peoria was built by Judge John C. Flanagan in 1837 on the east bluff area on Northeast Glen Oak Avenue. It was so cool and refreshing with breezes from the river and many beautiful trees. This American Federalist style house also gave us a spectacular view of the Illinois River Valley. This museum's special tribute is to “Women In War: The Role of Women at Home and on the Front during World War II.”

We saw a lovely display of a RS Prussia Mill Scene bowl and a Mum sugar and creamer on display.

The Pettengill-Morrison House

Museum on West Moss Avenue was built in 1868 by Moses Pettengill in the Second Empire architectural style and has 11 rooms. In 1900, a colonial revival porch and porte cochere were added giving the home a grand Victorian appearance. Later, Jean Morrison acquired the property from the John Boyd Stone family and gave it and its contents to the Peoria Historical Society,



which numbers over 500 members.

Its theme for the 2007 exhibit featured “Top Hats and Teacups” appropriate to the era with the Morrison collection of cups and saucers from all over the world since she was a world class traveler representing Italy, France, Germany, England, and Japan. Mrs. Morrison's lovely tea service represents three generations of her family.

What a wonderful treat we found Peoria to be! We topped off the day with our guide taking us to Lou's Ol' Fashioned Drive-In for a mug of homemade root beer.

Of course, the next day, Fred wanted to get a souvenir of his journeys and we went to the Illinois Antique Center and the famous local pub with real Irish food called Kelleghers, where we got “a hundred thousand welcomes.” That's a lot to squeeze into one glass of beer! Don't you think???

Anyway, we had a great time and, of course, it's always fun to see all our friends and visit again. We look forward to seeing everyone next year in Kentucky.

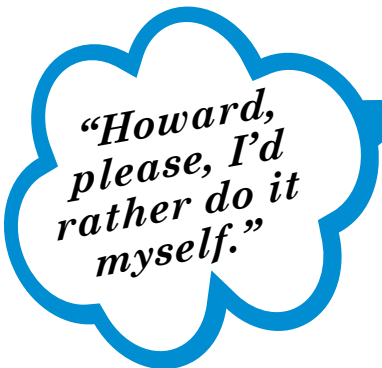

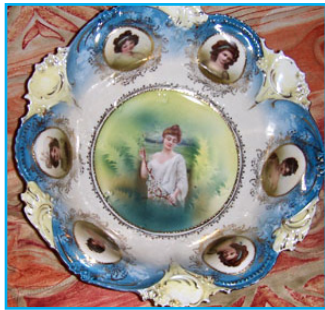

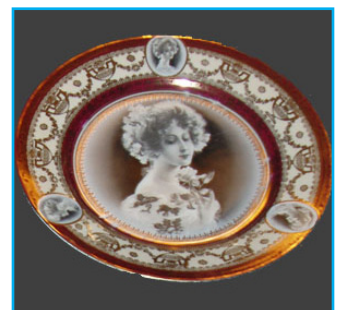
