President's Message Allen Di Marco

When you receive this edition of our newsletter, I trust you will begin to read it from the front cover. Also, I hope that after you read my message, that you immediately refer to my "to do" list and react accordingly so that you are able to reserve a room for convention, enjoy the fellowship of other members at our various functions, and plan your stay to optimize your visit to Grand Rapids!

Unfortunately, each year I get numerous phone calls from members at the last minute asking if I will call the hotel and get them the special RS Prussia Convention rate because they neglected to make their hotel reservations by the deadline set forth in our contract. I am happy to assist when possible, but after the cut-off date for reservations, the hotel is in the driver's seat.

Here are the dates and times that are important:

1. Hotel reservations must be made by **June 24, 2013** to insure the Club's room rate of \$109 plus applicable taxes.

- a. If you would like a refrigerator in your room, you must request it at the time you make your hotel reservations. A refrigerator has a \$10 one-time fee.
- b. If you would like a display table in your room, you must request it at the time you make your hotel reservations. A display table has a \$15 one-time fee.
- c. Our room rate is for a room with either two queen beds or one king bed.
- d. Full breakfast for two is included in the room rate.
- e. The hotel phone number is 616-957-1770. Be sure to ask for the Club's special room rate of \$109.

2. Please register prior to coming to convention. You received a blue registration form with your April newsletter and again with this issue. Please fill it out and return it with the fees to Mary Lou Bougher. **Pre-registration is a great help to Mary Lou and Ken!**

3. There are two club meals planned this year. One is an informal barbecue on Friday evening, and the other is our traditional banquet held on Saturday evening. When you register, please fill out the separate forms (banquet on the blue registration form and the white one for the picnic). Since we met the minimum numbers required by the caterers, the deadline for the picnic registration has been extended. Please return the picnic form and your check to Beth Vander Meer **no later than Friday, July 5**. Beth's address is on the registration form.

4. This is our first attempt at having club members open their homes for other club members to visit and view their RS Prussia collections. As stated in our previous newsletter, there are five "open homes" that you are welcome to visit. There is a map provided on page 7 where the homes are located so that you can plan your route if you wish to visit them on your way to convention. **Visits are only scheduled for Tuesday, July 16**. Each club member wishing to view a collection must contact the hosts directly. Individual phone numbers are also included on page 7. **Please do not contact the hosts prior to July 7**.
